Wearing of face coverings is now mandatory in places of worship (from 8 th Aug). This is communicated by the welcome team as people arrive and at the start of the service. Disposable face coverings are available for those who haven't brought their own.				
		•	As of 14 th Sept groups of more than 6 are against the law. Gathering in groups larger than this is not allowed and mingling between groups is not allowed. Measures are communicated via email, church website, YouTube channel, notices				
		•	during the service and posters. On entering tier 5 all church members are encouraged to 'stay at home' and access our online service which will be pre- recorded.				
		•	While initial provision was made for a small basic service to be held only for those without internet access, following the request made by the mayor of London, it was decided to not meet and instead provide printed or recorded copies of the service/sermon to those without internet.

		•	Those speaking at the front will use separate			
			lecterns and fixed microphones. This has been			
			communicated to those speaking at the front.			
		•	There will be no collection taken during the			
			service. Online giving will be encouraged			
			where possible. A collection box will be			
			available on the way out. Cash collections will			
			be handled with gloves.			
		•	On entering tier 5 there will be no provision for a monetary collection.			
			When live streaming the service only one			
		-	person will use the laptop and set up the live			
			stream - this is due to the small space around			
			the PA equipment and the potential for contact			
			with equipment which has been touched by			
			others. When different people are setting up			
			the sound and live stream this must be co-			
			ordinated so only one person is at the PA			
			equipment at one time.			

The Service

		 No refreshments and chat time after the service. There will be no Bibles in pews. People will be asked to bring their own Bibles if possible. A supply of Bibles will be available and quarantined for 48 hours before and after use. Capacity is limited to 60. The welcome team will turn away those who arrive after capacity has been reached, pointing them to the recording of the service online. If capacity is reached, we will consider an overflow room in the hall and a booking system for future services. There will be no Sunday Club during the services for the time being. The children's corner will not be available, to avoid multiple children touching the same items, and to take away the temptation of touching them. Sunday Club continues to take place online. Parents and guardians have been made aware of the changes to provision for children at services and that children must be supervised by parents or guardians and adhere to the same hand hygiene and social distancing practices. Individually packaged colouring packs are available for children. These are taken away after the service.

Toilets cleaned on Sunday afternoons. Bins containing potentially contaminated waste (in toilets as well as other parts of the church) should have liners which can be tied off at the end of a service. Prior to the church next opening (48 hours later) these can be taken out and put in a refuse sack. The kitchen and hall will not be used, reducing traffic in the corridor to the toilets. Hand sanitiser available at the entrance to the toilets. Soap and paper towels are available with hand- wash sinks in the toilets. Guidance for use of the toilets has been communicated via email, church website, YouTube channel and notices during the service. Outer doors are held open to avoid the need for touching them and increase ventilation. On entering tier 5 access to the hall will not be available.
